Cal Ripken autographed baseball – \$200

Get a baseball signed by, Cal Ripken, aka “The Iron Man”, who was one of the greatest short stops of all time, a successful entrepreneur and philanthropist. The Maryland native holds the record for most consecutive games played and the most consecutive all-star appearances at shortstop. He was a two time AL MVP and won the World Series in 1983. After baseball he has headed up Ripken Foundation and participated in other charities. He was voted into the Hall of Fame in 2007 with the third highest percentage of votes in the history of baseball.

Georgetown 2009-2010 All-Team Basketball – \$200

Get a basketball signed by the current members of the Georgetown Hoyas Men’s Basketball Team. This includes Greg Monroe, who is improving on his impressive freshman year, and is a surefire 1st round draft pick whenever he decides to move on to the NBA, Chris Wright, the junior guard who is second on the team in scoring, also signed the ball. Along with the up and comers Jason Clark, and Austin Freeman and the prize recruit of last years recruiting class Hollis Thompson.

Mike Green Hockey Stick - \$125

This stick was signed by Mike “Game Over” Green. Green holds the record for most consecutive games with a goal scored by a defenseman and is the best scoring defenseman in the NHL. The one time all-star also came with in one goal of breaking Sheldon Souray’s record of power play goals in a season. This photo is signed by 5 Redskins Quarterbacks. There is Joe Theissman who won Super Bowl XVII and was a two time Pro Bowler. Then Sonny Jurgensen, the Hall of Fame Quarterback who was a five time Pro Bowler and is a member of the Redskins Ring of Fame. Along with Doug Williams, the first and so far only black quarterback to start win a Super Bowl, he not only won Super Bowl XXII, he also was MVP. Next, there is Mark Rypien, the first Canadian born person to start as a QB in the NFL, he won Super Bowl XXII, and XXVI. Last but not least, there is, Billy Kilmer, the 1972 Pro Bowler and one of the 70 greatest Redskins.
